



Brain injury or head injury?



If this sounds like you, don't be afraid or ashamed to ask for help Help is available

Take a look inside this leaflet...

Brain injury or head injury?

→ Police custody nurses or emergency health services if you have just had a head injury.

→ Your GP if you think you might have had a brain injury in the past and want to find out how it might have affected you.

→ A person you trust or a person called an Appropriate Adult who can help or support you when you are speaking to the police, court or probation. You may need to ask for one.

→ An NHS service called liaison and diversion which works in the police station and in courts.

→ A solicitor who understands brain injury who can help with your defence.

→ An NHS service called RECONNECT for some people leaving prison who have health needs.

→ A Brain Injury Identity Card which can help people to understand any support needs you might have. You can get this from the charity Headway.

→ A prison officer, healthcare or education staff in prison.

→ A probation officer can do an assessment called a pre-sentence report to help the court to undertand your needs if you are convicted.
